Dear Mr. Morin,

Canada has a strong regulatory framework for vaccines which has its basis in the provisions of the Food and Drugs Act. The purpose of the Act is to prevent fraud and consumer deception and ensure consumer and purchaser safety.

Among other things, the Act provides Health Canada with broad powers to prevent the distribution of any biologic (including vaccines) which has been adulterated, labelled, sold or advertised in a misleading or deceptive way.

Furthermore, it is indeed illegal to distribute an unlicensed vaccine in Canada, with two exceptions: (1) use of the vaccine in an authorized clinical trial and; (2) release of a vaccine to a health care practitioner on the basis of compassionate grounds via Health Canada's Special Access Program.
